

Lesson Plan: Get Involved!

Grades 9 & 10	Objective Students take inventory of their involvement in school activities and learn about club and sport opportunities at DHS. They also learn the importance of extracurriculars.	Start Here (Hook) Getting involved in an extracurricular at DHS helps students stay engaged at school and helps them build interests and skills that will help them for postsecondary success.

Duration 25 minutes		

Team Building Activity: Sharing Current Activities

- 1) Turn and Talk to your classmate sitting next to you, asking them what club or sport they are involved in at DHS. If they are not involved in a club or sport, do they have a job or an activity outside of school? If they don't have any activity they do, have them say what sport or club they'd like to get involved in this year.
- 2) Now you will introduce your partner to the class one by one, explaining what activity or sport they are involved in. Remember to say their name as well when you introduce them.

Additional Activities:

- 1) **Class Pop Quiz:** Have students read the facts about school engagement/involvement on slide 3. As a class, come to a consensus if the fact is True or False. After reading all four statements, look at how the class did on slide 4.
- 2) **Index Card Activity:** Pass out index cards to all students. Have students write **two** activities or clubs they are interested in joining with their school email address. See club list with faculty sponsor to follow up with, so that we can connect interested student with faculty sponsor.
